OPENER, CLOSER:

Sides Face, Grand Square.

FIGURE: (twice for heads, twice for sides)
Head couples Lead to the right, and Circle to a line.
Right & Left Thru, Dixie Style to an ocean wave and then,
Boys Cross Run, Recycle, Sweep a Quarter.
Half Square Thru and then Trade By.
Left Allemande new corner, Promenade tonight.
Call me the prisoner of the highway,
Imprisoned by the freedom of the road.

MIDDLE BREAK:

Four Ladies Chain Three quarters round that ring now. Half Sashay, and Circle Left.
I've rode tobacco out of the Carolinas.
California wines; Left Allemande and Weave the Ring.
Some people work just to survive, yeah.
Swing your girl that's when we're most alive.
I'm the prisoner of the highway,
Imprisoned by the freedom of the road.

CLOSER:

Four Boys Promenade one time round that ring now. Come back Swing with your man.
Join hands Circle to the left go moving around the floor.
Left Allemande your corner and Weave the ring.
Some people work just to survive, yeah.
Swing your girl that's when we're most alive.
Call me a prisoner of the highway,
Driven on by my restless soul. Swing.
